SISTERS HOPE

ET POETISK LÆRINGSPOGRAM

Vi søger Københavns Kommune om at indgå et samarbejde med henblik på at søge puljen 'Artist in Residence under Huskunstnerordeningen' hos Statens Kunstmuseum til marts 2025. Formålet er at tilvejebringe ressourcer og en platform til at performancegruppen Sisters Hope kan tilbyde og udfolde et kunstnerisk og poetisk læringsprogram som tilbydes til kommunens skoler og ungdomsinstitutter (som fx Valby Skole og Viften på Vesterbro). Københavns Kommune vil ikke have direkte økonomiske omkostninger til projektet, der finansieres fuldt af Statens Kunstmuseum. For at lykkedes hermed vil kommunen dog skulle stå som den overordnede samarbejdspartner på ansøgningen.

Sisters Hope

Sisters Hope opererer i krydsfeltet mellem kunst, aktivisme, forskning og uddannelse. Vi er dybt forankret i interdisciplinære kunstpraksisser og manifesterer både vores værker på kunstmuseer, i det offentlige rum og som interventioner på andre institutioner som f.eks. skoler og rådhuse. Vi modtager fast støtte fra Statens Kunstmuseum og vores format *Sensuous City* blev i Politikken omtalt som en af Danmarks 5 mest betydningsfulde performanceværker nogensinde. I 2017 manifesterede vi *Sisters Academy* i Den Frie Udstillingsbygning som modtagere af Bikubenfondens Visionsprisen på 3 millioner. I dag står vi stærkt med et dedikeret publikum og en stor interesse og efterspørgsel af vores kunstneriske praksis både nationalt og internationalt.

Sanselig Læring

Som residence-kunstnere vil vi basere aktiviteterne på vores omfattende erfaringer med performancemetoden *Sisters Performance Method - Sensuous Learning*. Metoden er udviklet og forfinet af Sisters Hope siden 2008 og fokuserer på at integrere sanselige og æstetiske oplevelser i udviklings- og læringsprocesser. Metoden er forankret i en kunstnerisk forskningspraksis og sigter mod at "demokratisere det æstetiske" ved at gøre kunst og poesi tilgængelige for alle, uanset baggrund eller erfaring. Vi argumenterer for, at den æstetiske dimension har været underprioriteret siden Oplysningstiden og den industrielle revolution, hvor kognitive og rationelle opfattelser blev prioriteret over sanselige oplevelser. Med Sanselig Læring søger vi at genoplive den æstetiske dimension ved at fokusere på, hvordan kunst kan integreres i hverdagen og læringsmiljøer.

Metoden tager afsæt i "The Poetic Self" (Det Poetiske Selv), hvor vi hævder, at alle mennesker har en iboende poetisk kerne. Gennem forskellige aktiviteter og performative øvelser opfordres deltagerne til at udforske og udtrykke deres personlige poetiske fortællinger og sanselige oplevelser. Målet med Sanselig Læring er at styrke forbindelsen mellem mennesker samt at fremme en dybere forståelse af kunstens rolle i hverdagen. Dette opnår vi ved at aktivere sanserne og skabe et rum for poetisk udforskning, hvilket på sigt kan føre til en mere bæredygtig og æstetisk orienteret fremtid. Vores tilgang til læring gennem sanselighed er derfor ikke blot en metode til undervisning, men en kunstnerisk vision for

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et mere inkluderende og æstetisk samfund. En fremtidsvision som vi kalder "The Sensuous Society".

Målet med programmet er at vise, at kunst og poesi er en del af vores hverdag. Vi ønsker at styrke den kollektive forbindelse mellem deltagerne og fremme sanselighed i en hektisk og digitalt domineret verden.

Center for Sanselighed og lokal forankring

Vores engagement som artists in residence er sammentænkt med vores nye kunstneriske platform, Center for Sanselighed, som vi er i færd med at etablere i Valby. Denne ramme vil i programmet fungere som et smukt eksternt læringsrum som vi vil invitere deltagerne ind i. Vores helt grundlæggende ambition med Center for Sanselighed er at skabe en ramme hvor verden kan samles om det sanseliges værdi og betydning. Ikke mindst i forbindelse med det sanseliges potentiale i transitionen mod en mere bæredygtig fremtid. Det vil være et regenerativt og eftertænksomt åndehul, der står i modsætning til mange menneskers hektiske hverdagsliv. Denne kunstneriske ramme vil sikre os et stærkt fundament for vores virke som residence-kunstnere, hvor vi vil være forankret lokalt i byen. Vi har dertil etableret samarbejder med lokaludvalgene på Vesterbro/Enghave og i Valby med henblik på yderligere lokal forankring i de pågældende områder.

Afrunding

Vi håber meget at I vil være partnere på ansøgningen 'Artist in Residence under Huskunstnerordningen' til Statens Kunstfond. At bidrage til at realisere vores ambition om at skabe et nyskabende, relevant og ambitiøst kunstnerisk læringsprogram for unge borgere i Københavns Kommune.

Sammen med Københavns Kommune ønsker vi at søge Huskunstnerordningen hos Statens Kunstmuseum om honorarer til de performere som skal facilitere Sanselig Lærings-programmet i projektperioden. Københavns Kommune vil således ikke have direkte omkostninger forbundet i projektet. Der vil dog være en række in-kind udgifter til administration af en eventuel bevilling samt løbende statusmøder med en kulturkonsulent og Sisters Hope. Da vi ikke kender kommunens præcise honorartakster, er dette estimerede tal.
En stor del af programmet vil blive afviklet i vores kommende kunstneriske platform, Center for Sanselighed, i Valby. Udgifter til etablering og drift af denne platform afholdes af eksternt af Sisters Hope, hvilket således indirekte vil bidrage positivt til realiseringen projektet. Ligeledes modtager Sisters Hope årligt 1.3 millioner i driftsstøtte fra Statens Kunstmuseum hvilket sikrer kapaciteten til at organisere og administrere projektet internt hos Sisters Hope.

THE PERFORMANCE GROUP AND MOVEMENT SISTERS HOPE

Sisters Hope is an award-winning and nationally and internationally acclaimed performance group that operates at the intersection of performance art, research, activism, and education. They apply immersive, interventionist and intimate interactivity when they manifest their unique performances. They are currently working to manifest more sensuous and poetic environments and landscapes for being, being together and learning.

Sisters Hope is a Nordic-based performance group and movement with an associated international troop of performers and creatives from various backgrounds. Sisters Hope operate from their articulated vision of The Sensuous Society: The Sensuous Society: Beyond economic rationality. Suggesting a sensuous mode of being in the world. Do also see the two TEDx – Uppsala University (2015) a Society Carving the path towards a sustainable future through aesthetic inhabitation argued that we must create spaces, not only for participation in, but also for inhabitation of the sensuous and poetic through the arts to transition into a more long-term project Sisters Hope Home, a multi-year performance-installation in which the sensuous can always be inhabited. For many years Sisters Hope has aimed at enriching environments with an aesthetic dimension by exploring the connection between the sensuous and the sustainable. The poetic and the ecological mind and body.

They have developed their own performance method Sisters Performance Method. Sensuous Learning rooted in. Not a character, not a fiction but our inherent poetic potential that we explore and unfold. This is a requested method by many art schools and other educational programs both nationally and internationally and it currently runs as a four-month program.

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GRY WORRE HALLBERG
Artistic Director, Performance Artist and founder

Gry Worre Hallberg is the artistic director of Sisters Hope and has founded the large-scale project Sisters Academy. Furthermore, Gry is also behind the vision The Sensuous Society: Beyond economic rationality – which explores how the qualities of the sensuous relate to a more sustainable future, do also see her artistic research PhD Sensuous Society (2021, University of Copenhagen). Moreover, it is the visionary foundation for Sisters Hope's work. Besides being a requested teacher, speaker and facilitator, she has been invited to do two TEDx talks on the subject: "Sensuous society" at TEDxCopenhagen and "Sensuous Learning" at TEDxUppsalaUniversity. She has published a number of articles about Sisters Hope's work and method and new societies. Has received work grants from The Danish Arts Foundation for several years. Is appointed IETM Global Connector 2021–2022.

Beyond his formal education with a masters in Performance-design, Nikolaj has completed the international 'Executive Education Program for the Next Generation of Museum Leaders' at Claremont University, California under the Getty Leadership Institute in 2018.

The staging of the Boarding School is created like that with utmost care in all details. Everything is strange, but why strange? Because it is so consequently made, so beautiful, so deeply human, so widely open to interpretations. It needs your time, your surrender, your tenderness, and openness. It is a demanding piece of artwork, but if you surrender, it will stay with you forever.

The venue, the building of Den Frie is a scoop. The way the architecture of this untraditional classical building is being used to frame the artwork is brilliant. It is obviously how the building loves to be part of the activities, which underlines the symmetry of the architecture. And please give it some thought how much work has been done to stage this house with all the wrapping of fabrics, light, mirrors, carpets and objects. All this to make us, the visitors be part of another time, no past, no future but a contemporary fusion of it all.

I loved the constant subdued soundscape, I loved the clear-speaking trio of the Octopus, I loved everybody standing on the chairs before we could sit down to eat in the mirror dining hall, I loved the class of the well, I loved the combination of art, constructions, performance, natural science, sensuality, philosophy, aesthetic, I loved....
