


Slide projection anodised aluminium plates welded metal construction Archival Pigment Prints The Installation includes 8 black and white photographs, mounted on anodised aluminum plates, which are locked into a welded metal grid. While the studio photographs have been created within a couple of minutes, the slide projection on their back shows small scale-projected photographs of my brothers Mats and Jonah growing up over a timespan of more than 13 years.

The sequence of studio photographs has been made by Mats and me, one week prior to his second, complicated spine surgery.

## a failed attempt to photograph reality

In my first solo exhibition in Denmark, I present analog blackand-white photographs taken over the past three years. The photographic work focuses almost exclusively on the principle of abstract close-ups.

Starting from a photographic study of snow, asphalt, and photographic grain, I have collected images that engage with an analysis of public and social space. The works also explore the boundaries of photography itself, as I repeatedly negotiate the paper, the chemical representation of black and white, and the materiality of the medium.





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
